

**Harvard C.S. Kim (Harvey)**  
President and Chief Operating Officer  
Principal Executive, Mountain Region



Harvey Kim is the President and COO of Pelatron in charge of both its Hawaii and Utah operations. He is a co-founder of the Pelatron Center for Economic Development (PCED), a not-for-profit company which acquired Pelatron when it was an early-stage startup. With his partner Aimoku McClellan, they grew the company into a large high-tech manufacturing company with major locations in Hawaii and Utah that serve the federal defense industry.

Harvey spearheaded Pelatron's most successful program, Networking-On-The-Move (NOTM), since its inception in 2004 through concept development, prototyping, and production phases to give Marines the ability to exchange intelligence via satellite and radios while moving. NOTM was the first such capability in the military. It is now deployed worldwide, and has transformed the way Marines make battlefield decisions.

A combat-disabled Vietnam veteran, Harvey was a part of the first Space Shuttle program as an Air Force Officer at the Eastern Space and Missile Center (Cape Kennedy and Cape Canaveral) and witnessed Columbia's historic first launch. Prior to his commission, he served as avionics technician and technical instructor specializing in inertial navigation, fire control radar, and Terrain-Following Radar systems.

After retiring from the Air Force, he then served in a number of technical and financial positions in State and private-sector organizations including Vice President and COO of Alu Like Inc., technology incubation manager at the High Technology Development Corporation (HTDC), finance director of a large Waikiki live production, and IT manager for Kamehameha Schools/Bishop Estate.

Harvey has a Master of Public Administration degree from the University of Hawaii, a Bachelor degree in Computer Science from Roosevelt University, and a Bachelor degree in Accounting from Brigham Young University-Provo.

Past community activities include a Governor's appointment to the Natural Energy Laboratory of Hawaii Authority (NELHA) Board of Directors and a Governor's appointee to the State's School-to-Work commission. He also served as an Executive Committee member of the Mililani Neighborhood Board, President of a parent-teacher's association for a Hawaiian immersion school, youth soccer and basketball coach, and a JV volleyball coach at his Alma Mater, Kamehameha Schools. Harvey was awarded the Silver Beaver Award for over 25 years of exemplary service to the Boy Scouts of America. He is also actively involved with his Church. He and his wife, Della, have five children and eleven grandchildren
